Guía de la Iglesia

1. Todas las masas no pueden tener más de 100 personas presentes.

2. Cada persona debe usar una máscara sobre su nariz y boca.

Cada persona debe sentarse a 6 pies de distancia de otra persona a menos que sean de la misma familia. Las familias pueden sentarse juntas.

3. Cada persona debe entrar solo por la puerta trasera y salir por la puerta trasera.

4. Debe tener su nombre escrito en el libro mayor en el vestíbulo.

Todos deben poner desinfectante para manos en sus manos.

5. Si sales de la iglesia durante la misa, no puedes volver a entrar.

6. La formación de comunión debe mantener un distanciamiento social de seis pies entre las personas.

7. Cuando termine la misa, todos debemos salir por la puerta trasera, permitiendo que los acomodadores limpien los asientos antes de la próxima misa.



Church Guidelines

1. All the masses can have no more than 100 people in attendance
2. Each person must wear a mask over their nose and mouth.
3. Each person must sit 6 feet distant from another person unless they are from the same family. Families may sit together.
4. Each person must enter only through the rear door and exit through the rear door.
5. You must have your name written in the ledger in the vestibule.
6. Everyone is required to put hand sanitizer on their hands.
7. If you leave the church during the mass, you cannot re enter.
8. Communion lineup must keep social distancing of six feet between persons.
9. When mass is over we have to all leave by the back door allowing the ushers to wipe down the seats before the next mass.
